Kia Ora, Good evening Ladies and Gentlemen and お帰りなさい to New Zealand for the returnees.

Thank you very much for coming this evening. Tonight, I am very pleased to see JETs who have returned from Japan to Wellington after completing their contracts in August 2015 and welcome them back here to my Residence.

The Wellington chapter of the JET Alumni Association is involved in many Japan related community events and tonight a number of their members are able to join us so I hope that you will take the opportunity to hear about their upcoming events to stay connected with Japan and talk with them about their experiences coming home.

The Embassy of Japan supports the Wellington JET Alumni Association with their activities, organises a number of its own events and promotes other Japan-related events around the region. You can find information about these on the JICC.NZ Facebook Page and I sincerely hope that you are able to attend some of these. As you will know, there are some very exciting events planned in Japan in 2019 and 2020 so it is a very exciting time to stay connected with what is going on in Japan, whether it is through sporting, educational or cultural fields.

Last, but not least, I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of you who have taken part in the JET programme and returned to continue to contribute to strengthening ties between Japan and New Zealand. Applications for the 2016 JET Programme are already open so if you know any good candidates we sincerely hope that you will encourage them to apply for this amazing opportunity.

Welcome back to Wellington and thank you again for your efforts while on the JET Programme.
