

The Project for Construction of the Multipurpose Classroom and Installation of Solar Panels for Niue High School
Under
Grant Assistance for Grass-Roots Human Security Projects (GGP)

The Grant Contract for the Project for the Construction of the Multipurpose Classroom and Installation of Solar Panels for Niue High School under Japan's Grant Assistance for Grass-Roots Human Security Project (GGP) was signed on 4 March 2022 by Ms. Gaylene Tasmania, Director General of Social Services in Niue and on 23 March 2022 by Ambassador ITO Koichi of the Embassy of Japan in New Zealand respectively.

With this Project the Government of Japan will provide grant assistance of NZ\$ 287,401 for building a multi-purpose classroom (with storage and small meeting room) and installation of solar power generation equipment at the Niue High School. The multipurpose classroom will be used for supplementary lessons, special support classes for students with special needs, and vocational education and training. The project is expected to benefit approximately 240 current students and those who will enrol the high school in the future.

In addition, by installing solar power generation equipment which generates approximately 20% of the Niue High School's annual electricity consumption on its own, the project is expected to contribute to the Niue government's policy target of achieving 80% of electricity generation from renewable energy sources by 2025.
