Development Issue 1-1  Improving Social Services	[Background and current situation] In Niue, noncommunicable disease (NCD) such as diabetes, stroke, and cancer are on the rise, and efforts to reduce risk factors must be strengthened. In addition, the declining number of healthcare professionals and the aging of the population make it increasingly difficult to provide effective healthcare services, necessitating efforts focused on disease prevention and improving wellbeing. The need to respond to these improvements in social services is now critical. The expansion of social services is one of the priority areas in the Niue National Strategic Plan (NNSP) 2016-2026.				[Strategy] Accepting long-term and short-term trainees to develop human resources in the fields of medicine and healthcare, including preventive medicine, as well as vocational training and education. In addition, through Grant Assistance for Grassroots and Human Security Project, establish health and medical care facilities, and improve the learning environment, particularly in primary and secondary education. Fiscal and economic development and sustainable infrastructure are among the priority areas in the Niue National Strategic Plan (NNSP) 2016-2026. Furthermore, in the Niue Infrastructure Development Plan 2016, emphasis is placed on strengthening the foundation for sustainable economic growth.
